Minor ailments and conditions

You can get rapid advice and treatment from your local pharmacy. Under the Pharmacy First scheme, the pharmacist can also prescribe medicines for these conditions (normal charges and exemptions apply):

Ear-ache •

- Athlete's foot
- Teething and nappy rash Threadworms
- Diarrhoea •
- Skin rashes, impetigo •

Minor injuries to adults and children aged 3+

Minor injury units (MIUs) are able to help if you suffer:

- Minor scalds and burns Foreign bodies eg splinters
- Broken bone (fracture) Minor head injuries from a low fall
- Cuts, grazes, wounds • Muscle or joint injury, sprain, strain
- Skin complaint insect/animal/human bite or sting
- Localised allergic reactions and infections
- Minor eye injuries and infections eg wounds
